Voted – That a Tax of Three Dollars and Ten Cents which was improperly asessed against Mrs Anna Howell be refunded to hir

Voted – That Fences in order to be sufficient shall be four feet high

Voted – That Fence Viewers shall be entitled to twenty five Cents for Each certificate in lieu of being paid by the day

Voted – That this meeting stand adjourned until the first Tuesday of April next then to be held at the Town House at 10 Oclock AM
