Annual Town Meeting Minutes 1881

At the Annual Town Meeting held in the Village Hall, in and for the Town of Palmyra Tuesday March 1<sup>st</sup> 1881

At eight o'clock the polls were declared open and the electors then proceeded to ballot for Town Officers, and a proclamation made to close at 5 o'clock town time.

At 1:30 the Supervisor read his report which was approved and acceptedddd

The report of the commissioners was then read and approved

The report of the Overseer of the Poor was read and approved

The recommendation of the Board of Auditors to raise by tax, Fifteen Hundred dollars for the support of the poor for the coming year was adopted

The following resolution was read and adoptedddd

Resolved, That the Highway Commissioners of the town be reduced from three to one, the number to be reduced by the expiration of the term of office of the present commissioners.

It was moved and carried, that the Town appropriate a sum not to exceed One Hundred Dollars, for the purchase of a safe for the better preservation of the town records.
