## 1832 Minutes

1832 Minutes: At the annual town meeting of the inhabitants of the Town of Palmyra held at the Presbyterian Meeting House in the village of said town on Tuesday, April 3<sup>rd</sup>, 1832, present: Frederick Smith and M. W. Willcox, Esquires, Justices of the Peace of said town and Inspectors of said meeting.

Voted that we choose three Assessors.

Voted that we choose four Constables.

Voted that the Justices of the Peace be elected on the same ballot with the other officers.

Voted that the Town Sealer be elected by ballot and upon the same ticket with the other officers.

Voted that the Commissioners and Inspectors of Common Schools be allowed \$1 a day for their services.

Voted that the Collector have 5% for collecting.
