January 13, 1972

The regular monthly meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Palmyra was held January 13, 1972 in the Town Offices at 204 East Main Street, Palmyra. Supervisor called the meeting to order at 7:30 p.m. Those present were:

The minutes of the previous meeting were read by the Clerk. The correction noting that in the Part Town total bills paid, there was a transfer of \$7000.00 to the General Highway Fund. With this correction, the motion to accept the minutes was made by Mr. Andy Baran, seconded by Mr. LeRoy and carried with 4 ayes and no nos.

The following resolution was offered by Mr. Baran, seconded by Mr. White, and carried with 4 ayes and no nos.

WHEREAS, on November 11, 1971, a letter was received from Mrs. Elaine A. Scherer requesting permission to operate a Bait Shop at her home on 66 Higback Hill Road in the Town of Palmyra; and

WHEREAS, the Planning Board has made recommendation to the Town Board; and

WHEREAS, a variance must be granted in the Zoning Ordinance of the Town of Palmyra,

THEREFORE, a public hearing will be held on February 10, 1972 at 7:30 p.m. o'clock at the Town Office, 204 East Main Street, Palmyra.

Mr. Bruce Lasher appeared before the Town Board concerning his request for a letter from the Town saying it was permissible for him to have his office to keep the records only at his residence on South Townline Road, Town of Palmyra. of his business which is conducted in Rochester, New York. A motion to approve such a request was made by Mr. White, seconded by Mr. Baran, and carried with 4 ayes and no nos. The condition to be included was that

he comply with the existing Zoning Ordinances.

A letter from the Village of Palmyra requesting the use of two voting machines owned by the Town of Palmyra for their Village Elections was read by the Clerk. A motion made by Mr. White, seconded by Mr. LeRoy to loan the Village the voting machines with no charge to the Town was carried with a vote of 4 ayes and no nos.

The Board was requested to offer names of persons to form a committee to study becoming a first class town/ or add two councilmen and relieve the Justices of their duties on the Town Board due to their increased work load/ or remain the same as now. Names to be brought at the next Board meeting.

Upon a motion offered by Mr. LeRoy, seconded by Mr. White, funds were authorized for the Town Office to be cleaned weekly with a maximum of two hours per week. (Office is now cleaned every two weeks, 3 hours per.)

WHEREAS, (in and by a contract for fire protection to be furnished by the Village of Palmyra to the Palmyra Fire Protection District, the Village of Palmyra has been furnishing fire protection to the Palmyra Fire Protection District, which contract calls for the payment of \$8000.00 for the year 1972 to the Village of Palmyra, and

WHEREAS, the Board of Trustees of the Village of Palmyra has notified the Town Board of the Town of Palmyra that it has elected to terminate the existing contract as of December 31, 1971, and that it requires a new contract calling for the payment of the sum of \$8000.00 per year 1972 and 1973 to the said Village, instead of \$6000.00; such contract to contain the same general provisions as the existing contract except the sum to be paid and the date of termination of the contract.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that a public hearing on the question of entering into such new contract be held at the office of the Town Clerk, 204 E. Main St in the Village of Palmyra, N.Y. on the 10th day of February, 1972 at 6:00 o'clock in the evening of the said day for the purpose of considering such proposed new contract.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that notice of such public hearing be posted and published according to the statute in such case made and provided and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that if it appears after such hearing to be advisable, the Town Board of the Town of Palmyra enter into a new contract, containing the same general provisions as the existing contract, excepting however that such contract shall provide for the payment to the Village of Palmyra of the sum of \$8000.00 for the year 1972 and \$8000.00 for the year 1973 from the funds of such fire protection district, payment to be made during January of each year or after the execution of such contract by both parties. Such contract shall expire December 31, 1973.

All persons interested in the matter shall be heard at the time and place above mentioned.

RESOLUTION FOR PUBLIC HEARING ON A CONTRACT TO BE ENTERED INTO BY THE TOWN BOARD OF THE TOWN OF PALMYRA WITH PORT GIBSON FIRE DEPARTMENT INC.

WHEREAS, on or about June 10, 1965, there was established in the Town of Palmyra a fire protection district known as the Port Gibson Fire Protection District of the Town of Palmyra, N.Y., such district was created to take effect on January 1, 1966 with an amendment adopted on February 11, 1971, and

WHEREAS, the Port Gibson Fire Department Inc. entered into a contract on January 18, 1971 to service said district, and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the terms of said contract the Port Gibson Fire Department Inc. notified the Town of Palmyra, N.Y. that it desired to terminate said contract and renegotiate a new contract commencing with the year January 1, 1972, and

WHEREAS, the parties desire to enter into an agreement concerning the furnishing of fire protection to said district,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that a public hearing on the question of entering into such contract be held at the office of the Town Clerk, 204 East Main Street, in the Village of Palmyra, New York, on the 10th day of February, 1972 at 7:45 o'clock in the evening of the said day for the purpose of considering said contract.

be posted and published according to the statute in such case made and provided,

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that such proposed contract shall provide for the payment to the Port Gibson Fire Department Inc., of the sum of \$700.00 for the years of 1972, 1973, and 1974, from the funds of such fire protection district, the first payment to be made within 10 days after the execution of such contract by both parties or the month of January of said year, whichever shall occur last.

Such contract shall further provide that the party of the second part shall furnish such protection and shall at all times be subject to call for attendance upon any fire occurring in said district, as it is now constituted or as it shall hereafter be amended.

The contract shall contain the usual provisions regarding the liability of the first party to pay claims etc. All moneys to be paid to the second party by the first party shall be charged upon the fire protection district to be assessed and levied upon the taxable property in said district.

A motion made by Mr. White, seconded by Mr. LeRoy and carried with 4 ayes and no nos. the Cemetery caretakers are as follows: Maple Avenue, Larry Argus-- \$25.00; Cemetery at the corner of Lyon Road and North Creek Rd., Arthur Bebb--\$10.00; John Swift Cemetery, \$125.00, (NO caretaker named).

## PALMYRA HISTORIAN'S REPORT FOR 1971

This year I've had several inquiries for information on Palmyra families. I spent quite some time going over Palmyra papers for an obituary notice that one man wanted. Then found the information in the obituary card file in the Library. Another inquiry I asked Mrs. C.C. Nesbitt for help as I wasn't sure what the woman wanted.

She graciously took over and found the material needed.

A sixth grader at the Webster school chose Palmyra for the Town for her Social Studies project. I sent her information on the founding of the Town and the dates of Historical events and also the pamphlet on Palmyra that Historic Palmyra has.

I was kept busy for several weeks and especially the Sunday before the assignment was due on Palmyra for the Palmyra-Macedon Social Studies pupils. I believe some of them hadn't given any thought of their assignment until that last day. I enjoyed trying to give them enough information to write their 300 words. I would have been helpless without the Tom Cook book on Palmyra.

I am still helping with the Inventory at the Kings' Daughters' Museum. There is so much there it will take us many hours before it is completed.

For Canal Days, I put a display of toys in a store window. I exhibited dolls and doll clothes mostly.

As I have used the card file of the obituaries at the Library so much for genealogy, I've decided to cut out the death notice from the Palmyra papers, paste them on cards, and put them in alphabetical order. This will probably help future Historians more than it will me, but it is so much easier when looking up families for genealogy.

I attended two of the three County Town Historian meetings and enjoyed them very much. They are both informational and inspirational.

I have also continued the file of articles from the various papers concerning Palmyra and Palmyra people.

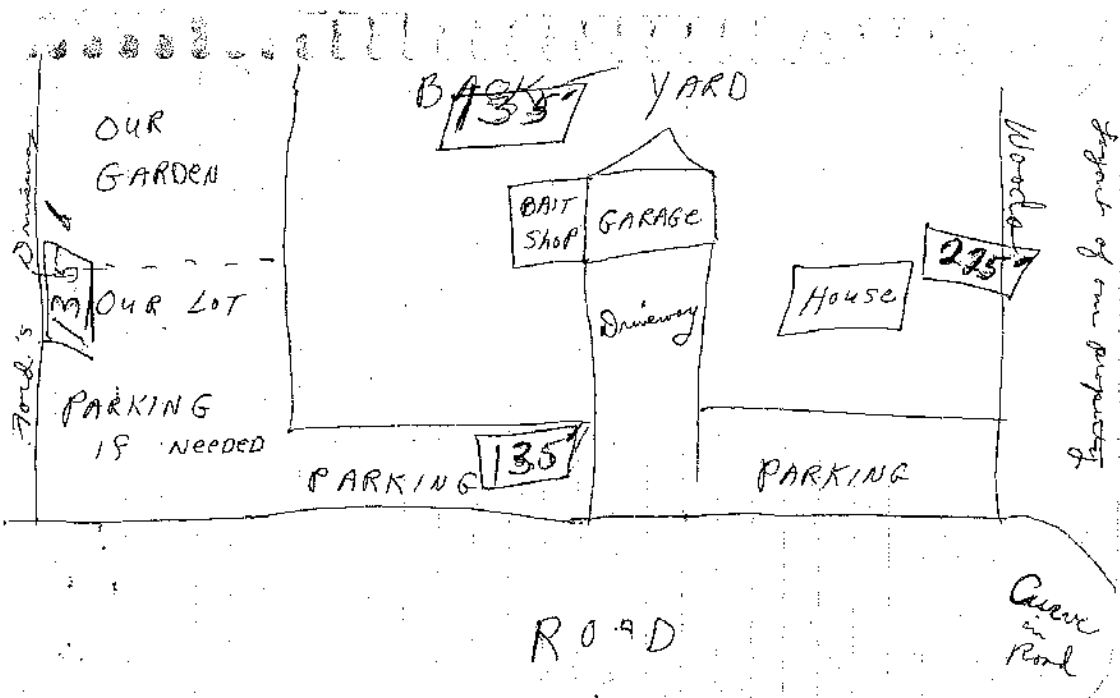

Following a short discussion on the Division for Youth Contract, a motion was made by Mr. White, seconded by Mr. Pierce to authorize the application for funds from the Division for Youth for a Recreation Project for commence June 1, 1972, as per copy of application. Motion was carried with 4 ayes and no nos. *Youth Contract approved*

Town Councilman Andrew Earan joined the meeting at this time.

Mr. & Mrs. Thomas Ray and Mr. & Mrs. Fred Batz appeared before the Town Board to present a petition signed by 108 people representing the Maple Ave. Water District. Mr. Ray was spokesman and offered the petition in regard to a request of 4 home-owners on Meadow Drive. for Water Service from the Maple Ave. Water District. Mr. & Mrs. Ray, Mr. & Mrs. Batz along with Mr. & Mrs. Edward Ramsey, who are also home-owners on Meadow Drive, held a discussion with the Board on their request for water. These residents of Meadow Drive were advised that, if the petition is approved, the expense of this water service would be totally theirs. Mr. Bedette thanked the group for appearing and they were informed that they would be advised of the Board's action and decision on this matter. The question was referred to the Water Committee for their recommendation. *Request of 4 home-owners on Meadow Dr. for Water*

A letter from Mrs. Bonnie Hunt, So. Creek Rd., Palmyra was read by the Clerk. This was a request for permission to operate a beauty shop in her home. The Board was assured there was ample parking space to accommodate several cars for off-street parking. Considerable discussion was held on the subject of this home being a Mobile home, an existing non-conforming building under the Zoning Ordinance. The Board asked Mrs. Hunt to procure written authorization from the State that a beauty business is allowable in a mobile home before they could make a decision. *Request by Hunt for Beauty Shop*

Mr. & Mrs. Leonard Maier of Rochester, N.Y. made a written request to the Board for permission to operate a restaurant and doughnut shop in the former Fred Ford property on Route 31 E. After some discussion, the Board decided that Mr. Maier should submit a plot plan or sketch of the

property, including a parking plan before a decision can be reached.

WHEREAS, said rules and regulations governing the furnishing of water in each of the water districts of the Town of Palmyra, Wayne County, New York, became effective October 1, 1950, and

WHEREAS, pursuant to section 198 of the Town Law, State of New York, the Town Board of the Town of Palmyra has the right to adopt from time to time ordinances, rules and regulations for the option of the water district and the use of water therein, and

WHEREAS, pursuant to section 11, subdivision e of the rules and regulations governing the furnishing of water in each of the water districts in the Town of Palmyra, Wayne County, New York, provides "the Town Board reserves the right at any time to rescind, modify, alter, amend or add to these rules and regulations, and the schedules, rates and charges governing the furnishing of water and a copy of the rules and regulations brought up to date shall be on file at all times in the office of the Town Clerk of the Town of Palmyra and also in the office of the Village Clerk of the Village of Palmyra" and

WHEREAS, the Town of Palmyra has entered into a new contract for the Purchase of water from the Village of Palmyra, wherein and whereby the Town of Palmyra shall pay to the Village of Palmyra effective the 1st day of June, 1972, at the rate of \$1.12 for each 100 cubic feet delivered to the Town of Palmyra during each quarter for the term of said contract, which contract terminates on November 30, 1974.

WHEREAS, the following amendment of rules and regulations governing the furnishing of water in each of the water districts in the Town of Palmyra is necessary by virtue of the increased rate and has been introduced before the Town Board, to wit: an amendment to rules and regulations governing the furnishing of water in each of the water districts in the Town of Palmyra, Wayne County, New York, as adopted October 1950.



That the aforesaid rules and regulations are amended by adding the following unnumbered paragraphs to Section 3 of said rules and regulations:

In the event that the 15th day of the month is a Sunday or legal holiday, the quarterly bill may be paid on the next business day without penalty.

Water rents and charges for all consumers within said district shall be from and after June 1, 1972, and the same are fixed and established as follows, viz:

Quarterly water rates, first 1,000 cubic feet at \$1.31 per 100 cubic feet, next 1,000 cubic feet at \$1.22 per 100 cubic feet, next 1,000 cubic feet at \$1.14 per 100 cubic feet, all over 3,000 cubic feet at \$1.12 per 100 cubic feet, minimum rate for each quarter or part thereof \$7.00.

The consumer shall deposit in advance and/or reimburse if any deposit shall be insufficient to cover the cost incurred, any and all charges assessed or levied against the Town of Palmyra or any of its water districts by the operator of the water districts or by independent contractors required to be hired for the benefit of the consumer for the following services: (a) installation from the main to and including the curb box, (b) thawing of frozen pipes, (c) checking and adjusting the meter, (d) damage and replacement of the meter, (e) inconvenience to the employees of the operator or of the Town of Palmyra (f) such other miscellaneous charges which may be incurred from time to time.

The rental charge for all water meters used in the district and not owned by the consumer shall be a quarterly charge of \$.75 for each meter which charge shall be added to the quarterly bill rendered to the consumer."

Any charge, assessment or penalty under any rule or regulation adopted governing the furnishing of water as enacted or amended which is unpaid for a period of 180 days shall be a lien on the real property occupied by the consumer and shall be added to the real estate tax levied and assessed against the premises so occupied by the consumer.

The effective date of this amendment to the rules and regulations shall be June 8, 1972, and effective to all charges and bills or statements received by the consumer after June 8, 1972.

The Board authorized Mr. DeBrine to procure and erect suitable warning signs and secure necessary easements to construct proper drainage ditches.

There are 2 districts in the Town of Palmyra which are approaching the 600 figure and the purchase of an additional voting machine should be considered.

*Grievance Day Review Board*  
 Mr. Kirchhoff, Assessor, joined the meeting at this time. He informed the Board that Grievance Day will be held Tuesday, June 20, 1972 and will be conducted by the Review Board, not by the assessor. The assessor will be present to answer questions. There are 3 members on the Review Board at this time and a 4th member will be appointed before Grievance Day. Mr. Kirchhoff supplied the requested information in regard to granting exemptions to taxpayers over 65. The following resolution was offered by Mr. Pierce, seconded by Mr. White and passed with 5 ayes and no nos.

 BE IT RESOLVED THAT: Residents 65 years of age, pursuant to applicable statutes, be entitled to a 50% exemption on the Real Estate taxes levied by the Town of Palmyra, providing they qualify and have an income less than \$3000.00.

*Report by F. Toole*  
 An excellent report by Francis Toole, Zoning Enforcement Officer, on Junkyard operations and Unlicensed vehicles on private property was reviewed by the Board. Operators must correct violations as noted in the report before licenses are granted.

A motion to pay the following bills was made by Mr. White, seconded by Mr. Pierce and carried with 5 ay and no nos.

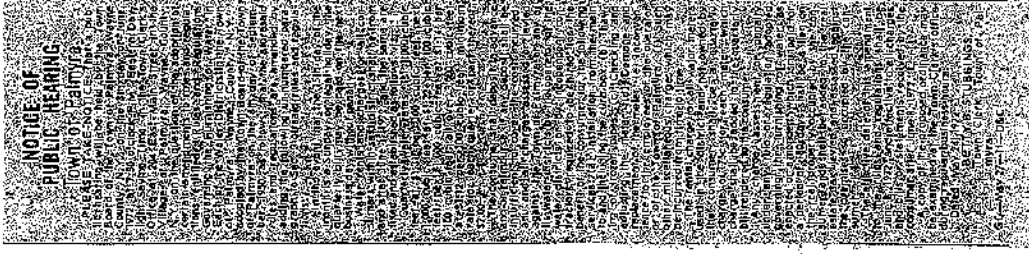

The rental charge for all water meters used in the district and not owned by the consumer shall be a quarterly charge of \$1.75 for each meter which charge shall be added to the quarterly bill rendered to the consumer.

Any charge, assessment or penalty under any rule or regulation adopted governing the furnishing of water as enacted or amended which is unpaid for a period of 30 days shall be a lien on the real property occupied by the consumer and shall be added to the real estate tax levied and assessed against the premises so occupied by the consumer.

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The Public Hearing, scheduled for this time in regard to the Resolution adopted by the Town Board on Rules and Regulations for the Water Contract with the Village of Palmyra, was opened by Supervisor Bedette at 7:30 P.M. Mr. Wilson Dieffenderfer attended this hearing. Several questions were answered relative to increase in rate, maintenance, repairs, and financing. A motion made by Mr. LeRoy, seconded by Mr. White that the hearing be closed, was carried with a vote of 4 ayes and no nos.

The regular meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Palmyra was called to order by Mr. Bedette at 7:55 P.M. on Thursday, June 8, 1972 in the Town Offices, 204 East Main Street, Palmyra, New York with the following Members present: Supervisor Bedette, Town Councilmen Raymond LeRoy and Andrew Baran, Town Justice Harry White, Town Attorney Paul Rubery, Highway Superintendent James DeBrine, Jr., and Town Clerk Betty Stubbings.

Robert Kirchhoff, Town Assessor, asked to speak to the Town Board briefly about Grievance Day and the newly adopted Resolution for exemptions to over-65 year olds. He announced times he will be available in the Town Office Friday evenings and Saturdays before Grievance Day to answer questions which may arise concerning 1972 assessments.

The minutes of the May meeting were read by the Clerk. A motion made by Mr. Baran, seconded by Mr. LeRoy that the minutes be approved as read was carried with 4 ayes and no nos.

Mr. David Baker appeared before the Board in regard to his application for a Mobile Home Park, the Waterways Trailer Park. The Clerk was asked to check with Dr. Adams, Health Officer, on his granting approval for 14 Trailer spaces indicated on the diagram, before the Board would make a final decision.

At this time, Francis Toole, Zoning Enforcement Officer, held a discussion with the Board in regard to Junkyard Operators. Mr. Gilfus' application was approved by the Town Board, but the applications of Mr. Breemes and Mr. Pulcini were denied until discrepancies noted in his report are corrected.

The next order of business was further discussion on the request of 4 home-owners on Meadow Drive for water from the Maple Avenue Water District. Mr. Rubery read a letter from Mr. Malone, Town Engineer. Mr. Malone indicated that, in his opinion, after taking pressure tests with Mr. VanStten, there is sufficient water pressure and quantity available from the present system to satisfy the normal domestic service for an added 11 potential customers. This includes the 4 out-of-district pet owners and 7 additional lots now located within the Maple Avenue District not yet built upon. With a motion made by R. LeRoy, seconded by H. White and carried with 3 ayes and 1 no, the Board granted approval to the 4 Meadow Drive residents for water, pending

final approval from the Village Board and the execution of individual contracts with the 4 petitioners.

Mr. Rubery offered the following Unsafe Building Ordinance for the Board's consideration:

PROPOSED ORDINANCE  
UNSAFE BUILDINGS AND STRUCTURES ORDINANCE  
OF THE  
TOWN OF PALMYRA

Section 1. Title

This ordinance shall be known as the Unsafe Buildings and Structures Ordinance of the Town of Palmyra.

Section 2. Purpose

The purpose of this ordinance is to provide for the removal or repair of buildings or structures either residential, industrial or business in nature for structures which have or may have a use which are, may now be or shall hereafter become dangerous or unsafe to the public.

Section 3. Inspection

When in the opinion of the zoning enforcement officer of the Town of Palmyra, or in the event that there shall be a building inspector in the Town of Palmyra in the opinion of the building inspector who is hereafter designated as the inspector and enforcement officer of the ordinance, any building or structure located in the Town shall be deemed to be unsafe or dangerous to the public, the inspector shall make a formal inspection thereof, and report in writing to the Town Board the inspectors findings and recommendations in regard to the building or structure removal or repair.

Section 4. Action of the Town Board on the Inspector's Report

The Town Board shall thereafter promptly consider the report of the inspector, and if it finds from said report that there is ground to believe that such building, buildings or structures or structure are dangerous or unsafe to the public, the Town Board by resolution shall order the building's or structure's removal or repair, if the same can be safely repaired, and further order that a notice shall be served personally upon the owner or one of the following, (a) the executor or legal representative of the owner's estate, the agent, lessee or any other person having a vested or contingent interest in the premises as shown by the last preceding assessment roll of the Town and/or by the records of the Town Clerk's office. If no person can be reasonably found to be served, then by mailing a copy of such notice to such person or corporation by registered mail addressed to his last known address and by securely posting a copy of such notice upon said premises.

Section 5. Notice

The notice to be served shall contain the following: (a) a description of the premises, including its location, (b) brief statement setting forth the

particulars in which the building or structure is unsafe or dangerous, (c) an order requiring the same to be made safe and secure or to be removed, (d) that the securing or removal of the said structure or building shall commence within 30 days of the mailing or service of the notice and be completed within 60 days thereafter, (e) in the event of neglect or refusal of the person or corporation served with a notice to comply with the same, a survey of the premises will be made by a Board of Survey composed of an inspector, architect, to be named by the Town Board and a practical builder, engineer, architect appointed by the person or corporation so notified, who must appoint said builder, engineer, or architect within 10 days of the service of said notice. In the event of the refusal or neglect of said person or corporation to make such appointment, the two men named to the Board of Survey by the Town Board shall make the survey and report. In the event that the building or structure shall be reported to be unsafe or dangerous under such survey, an application will be made to the Supreme Court of the State of New York for an order determining the said structure to be a public nuisance and directing that it shall be repaired and secure or taken down and removed, (f) that the land on which the said building or structure is located will be assessed for all costs and expenses incurred by the Town in connection with the proceeding pursuant to this ordinance to remove or to repair, including the cost of actual removing or actual repairing the said building or structure.

#### Section 6. Service of Notice

Said notice may be served in addition to the provisions above in the following manner: (a) by delivery of a copy thereof to any adult person residing in or occupying said building or structure, (b) by personal service upon the holder of a mortgage secured on the land upon which the building or structure stands or by serving said mortgagee by mailing to such mortgagee by registered mail a copy of said notice.

#### Section 7. Proceedings in the Event of Failure to Comply: Survey and Report

In the event of the neglect or refusal of the owner or holder to comply with the said order of the Town Board, a survey of the said premises shall be made in the manner prescribed: (a) the Board of Survey as appointed by said Town Board, and the owner if the owner or the owner's representative pursuant to the statute shall appoint a member of the Board of Survey, shall submit a written report as to its findings in regard to the unsafe or dangerous condition of the said building or structure, (b) within 5 days after it has been submitted to the Town Board, a signed copy of such report or survey shall be posted on said structure or building, (c) the Town Board shall affix the reasonable compensation for the surveyors which shall be a cost included under this ordinance.

#### Section 8. Finding Under Survey

In the event that the said survey report shall find that the said structure and/or building is unsafe or dangerous, the Town Board may pass a resolution directing the Supervisor of the Town to make application at a special term of the Supreme Court of the State of New York in the judicial district in which said property is located for an order determining that the building and/or structure be a public nuisance and directing that it shall be repaired and secured or taken down and removed, and the cost of said repair and/or taking down or removal is to be a lien on the property pursuant to this ordinance.

Notice of said application shall be duly served upon the owner or such other party upon whom the first notice was served in accordance with the Civil Practice Law and Rules. If said party cannot properly be served, then the said party may be served by publication in accordance with the rules of the Civil Practice Law and Rules.

If such order is duly made and granted, a certified copy thereof shall be served on the party either personally served by notice initially or by re-



gistered mail as is hereinabove provided, and the event that notice of the application of Supreme Court is by publication a copy of said order shall be affixed to the premises at least 10 days prior to commencement of the repair, taking down or removal and a copy of said order will be mailed to the last known address of a person having an interest in said property.

Section 9. Costs and Expenses

All costs and expenses incurred by the Town in connection with any proceedings and all proceedings, including the removal and/or repair of said premises and the payment of the surveyors shall be assessed and levied against the land on which said structure and/or building stands. Such assessment shall be assessed in the next Town assessment roll as an additional tax to the regular tax assessment against such property, and the same shall be levied and collected in the manner provided as the regular Town tax.

Section 10. Hearing

The owner of the property, upon proof of ownership, shall be entitled to a hearing on the findings of the building inspector and upon the findings of the Board of Survey at any time prior to the enactment of a resolution by the Town Board authorizing the Supervisor to make an application to the Supreme Court of the State of New York for an order determining the building or other structure to be a public nuisance, and directing that it shall be repaired and secured or taken down and removed. The owner or his representative shall file written notice of a demand with the Town Board for a hearing showing proof of his ownership or vested interest in said building and/or structure or the land upon which it is situated, and said request shall state such exception to the findings of the building inspector and/or the Board of Survey as they have been determined hereinabove and said notice shall request a hearing not later than 14 days after the filing of said request for a hearing. If no hearing is requested, then the Town shall proceed as hereinabove. If a hearing is requested, the owner, the Town and any other interested parties may present witnesses and any and all proof relating to the matters and all parties may appear either in person or by an attorney. The hearing shall be conducted by the building inspector. At the conclusion of the hearing, the determination of the building inspector shall be made in writing and a copy of the same shall be served on all parties who appear therein and a copy shall be filed with the Town Board. The decision and determination shall further state whether the original survey report is confirmed, modified or reversed. If reversed, no further proceedings shall be had until such time as the procedure pursuant to this ordinance is taken, once again in respect to said building or structure. But in any event unless there shall be a catastrophe intervening not less than 6 months from the date of said decision or determination reversing said proceeding. If the original survey is confirmed or modified and then confirmed, the building inspector shall include an order directing the owner to proceed in accordance therewith and shall further specify that unless the work is commenced within 15 days after service of said order as provided for notice hereinabove of the building inspector's finding and completed within a reasonable time thereafter which the building inspector shall designate as a part of his determination, the penalties hereinafter provided shall be invoked. Upon notification that the owner of the unsafe building or structure has failed to complete or refused to complete or repair the unsafe building or structure or the removal of the same, the building inspector shall report the same to the Town Board. The Town Board may direct that the Town shall cause the repair or removal of the same building. After the work has been completed, the inspector shall file with the Town Board a verified statement of the actual costs of the same, together with the costs of the hearing and other survey work which had been performed pursuant to this ordinance. Upon receipt of the costs, the Town Board shall direct that the total cost to the Town shall be added to the assessment roll and collected as hereinbefore provided for where no hearing

has been held.

In addition to any and all of the payments hereinabove provided for in the lien or assessment of taxes, notwithstanding any provision herein to the contrary, Town may at its election institute suit against the owner of the said premises for the direct cost and all costs that the Town incurred in respect to the subject premises, together with the reasonable attorney's fees and interest at 7½ percent per annum or such other maximum legal rate from the date of said advance against the owner personally for the amount or amounts expended by the Town. The imposition and collection and any fine or penalty hereinafter prescribed or an assessment upon the taxes shall not bar the right of the Town to collect the costs for removal or repair of any unsafe structure or building has herein prescribed.

In the event that the owner fails to complete the repairs or to remove the unsafe building or structure, at any stage of the proceeding, the owner shall be subject to the same procedures and penalties as herein set forth.

In the event that after the first notice by the inspector has been served, there is a transfer of title to the premises which is the subject of any proceeding pursuant to this ordinance, such transfer shall be no defense to any further proceedings under this ordinance.

#### Section 11. Penalty

Any person or corporation upon whom a notice has been served pursuant to this ordinance who fails, neglects or refuses to place such unsafe building or structure in a safe condition as designated, or who violates any provision of this ordinance or any lawful order of the inspector or who instructs the inspector in carrying out the provisions of the ordinance, shall upon conviction thereof be subject to a fine of not more than \$250 for each such violation. Each week during which such violation continues shall constitute a separate offense.

#### Section 12. Effective Date

This ordinance shall take effect 10 days after due posting and publication that the ordinance had been adopted.

A motion was made by Mr. White, seconded by Mr. Bedette to hold a public hearing at the next regular meeting to consider the adoption of the Unsafe Buildings and Structures Ordinance. The motion was denied after a vote of 2 ayes and 2 nos, Mr. Baran and Mr. LeRoy voting no. After further study of the Ordinance, the matter will be re-considered at a future meeting with a full Board present.

Harry White presented a copy of the Annual Report of the Palmyra Fire Department to the Board for review.

Supervisor Bedette advised the Board there would be an increase in Blue Shield rates, effective July 1, 1972.

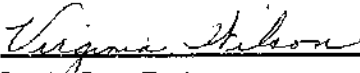

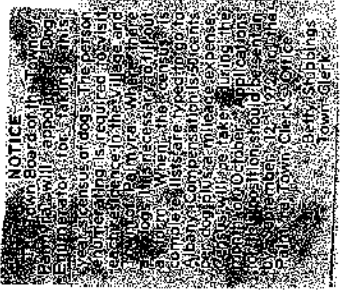

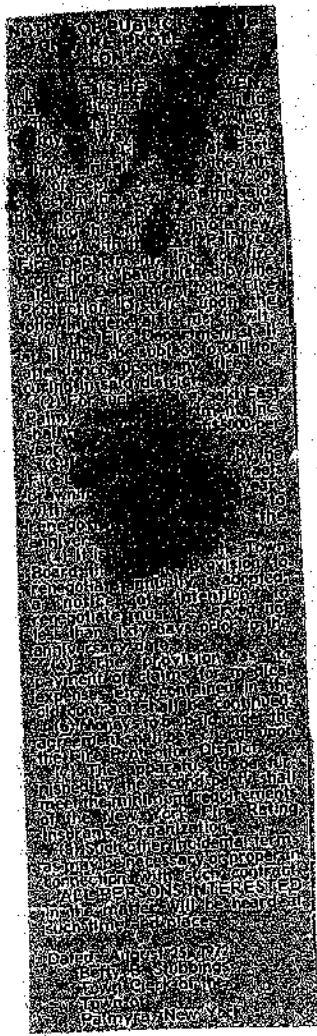

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The Public Hearing on the Fire Protection Contract between the East Palmyra Fire Dept. and the Town of Palmyra was opened at 7:30 P.M. by Supervisor Bedette at the East Palmyra Fire Hall in East Palmyra, New York. Members of the Town Board attending the hearing were: Supervisor Ellsworth Bedette, Town Councilmen Raymond LeRoy and Andrew Baran, Town Justice Harry White and Town Clerk Betty Stubbings. Interested persons attending were: Ralph Withey, Matthew Engels, Arie Benne, Joseph Blanche, Harry Tellier, Roger Klaver, Raymond Goossen, Harlin Tyler, Frank Gorall, Charles Eckert, Don VandenBout, Harry Wilkins, Fred Harding. The Notice of Public Hearing was read by the Clerk.

A short discussion on the Fire Protection Contract was held with Sec. Gorall explaining briefly the reasons for the needed increase in payment by the Town of Palmyra for the Fire Protection. The question of the amount of increase in taxes was raised. Supervisor Bedette reported an approximate figure of \$.24 per thousand increase in taxes. All those in attendance voted in favor of the new contract.

A petition in regard to a request for a speed zone in East Palmyra was presented to Supervisor Bedette.

A motion made by Andrew Baran, seconded by Raymond LeRoy that the Public Hearing be closed was carried with a vote of 4 ayes and no nos.

The Town Board reconvened at the Town Offices to proceed with the regular Town Board meeting. Town Highway Superintendent James DeBrine, Jr. and Town Attorney Paul Rubery were also in attendance. Town Justice Hart Pierce, Jr. was absent.

Supervisor Bedette opened the meeting at 8:00 P.M.. The minutes of the August meeting were read by the Clerk. A motion made by Raymond LeRoy and seconded by Harry White that the minutes be accepted as read was carried with a vote of 4 ayes and no nos.

WHEREAS, a Public Hearing was held in the East Palmyra Fire Hall concerning the proposed Fire Protection Contract for the East Palmyra Fire Protection District and, WHEREAS, the individuals appearing at said Public Hearing were all in favor of the increase in the cost of the operation of the East Palmyra Fire Protection District, and, WHEREAS, the East Palmyra Fire Department, Inc. had demonstrated a need for additional funds for operation and to continue Fire Protection within the District.

NOW THEREFORE, a motion by Harry White, seconded by Raymond LeRoy was carried with a vote of 4 ayes and no nos, that the Town of Palmyra enter into a contract on behalf of the East Palmyra Fire Protection District with the East Palmyra Fire Dept., Inc. for a period of four (4) years at Five Thousand (\$5,000) Dollars per year. All other terms shall be the same

as in previous contracts. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED: that the Supervisor, Ellsworth Bedette is authorized to execute the contract on behalf of the Town of Palmyra.

Notes from the Planning Board reporting action taken at their meeting. Approval was granted to plans posted for this meeting and the Planning Board made recommendations to the Town Board in regard to Mr. Linblad's application.

The Clerk reported the resignations of 2 Election Inspectors and 2 Alternates and offered the names of Nora O'Brien and Janice Fitzgerald as replacements for the regular inspectors.

The Clerk also reported a call from Lorene Warner, Town Historian, reminding the Town Board of the Wayne County Sesquicentennial taking place next year (1973).

Under unfinished business, the Board considered the applications of Marvin VanBortel, Mr. & Mrs. Robert Stubbings, Marjories Littlejohn, and Susan Collins for the position of Dog Enumerator. By Motion of Harry White, seconded by Andrew Baran, the Board appointed Marvin VanBortel to this position. Motion was carried with a vote of 4 ayes and no nos.

Continuing under old business, a short discussion was held on the Financial Report of the Palmyra Community Center.

A motion made by Raymond LeRoy, seconded by Harry White gave approval of the Town Board to the appointment of Nora O'Brien and Janice Fitzgerald as Election Inspectors. Motion carried with 4 ayes and no nos.

The application of Donald Quigley for a Permit to place a trailer on property on Garnsey Road was denied because of insufficient information by motion of Harry White. Motion was seconded by Andrew Baran and carried with a vote of 4 ayes and no nos.

A short discussion was held on the dangerous conditions existing at the gravel pit located on the Breemes property. Francis Toole, Zoning Enforcement Officer had received complaints from neighbors.

The petition from residents of East Palmyra in regard to setting a 30 mile Speed Limit on Main Street of East Palmyra was considered by the Board. After some discussion, the following resolution to send a request to the State for restrictions on speed in this area was offered by Andrew Baran,

seconded by Raymond LeRoy and carried with a vote of 4 ayes and no nos:

WHEREAS: the residents of the Hamlet of East Palmyra have requested that a Speed Zone be established within the following geographical area which is known as a portion of East Palmyra, bounded and described as follows:

1. The Westerly boundary on South Creek Road to be 1000 feet from the intersection of South Creek Road and East Palmyra-Port Gibson Road as measured along the South Creek Road.
2. The Southerly Boundary of said Speed Zone to be a point 1500 feet Southerly as measured along East Palmyra-Port Gibson Road from the intersection of the East Palmyra-Port Gibson Road and the South Creek Road.
3. The Easterly Boundary would be approximately 800 feet as measured along the Tellier Road from the intersection of Tellier Road and East-Palmyra - Port Gibson Road.
4. The Northerly Boundary to be 200 feet North of the intersection of North Creek Road with the continuation of East Palmyra - Port Gibson Road.

AND WHEREAS, the number of residences and concentration of people has increased and whereas the traffic has increased, the Town Board hereby respectfully requests that a reduced speed zone be established in the area outlined above.

Supervisor Bedette reported that he had talked with Village officials in regard to the unfavorable conditions at the Dump and reported that the Village is aware of the problems and are attempting to correct same.

Town Attorney Paul Rubery reported that the public hearing for the Maple Ave. Water District will be held Wednesday, October 4th at 2:00 P.M..

Items brought before the Board for discussion by James DeBrine, Jr., Town Highway Superintendent included: Contracts on Ice Control, work on Le-Roy Road, need for a man to replace A. Campbell, Jr., Budget items including, road work and salaries.

A request for 2 new tires was approved by motion of Andrew Baran. The motion was seconded by Harry White and carried with a vote of 3 ayes and no nos.

The following bills were ordered paid by motion of Harry White, seconded by Andrew Baran. Motion carried with 3 ayes and no nos.

Their request involves a change of use in an Agricultural Zone and they asked that the Board schedule a public hearing as is required by Zoning regulations. BE IT RESOLVED, that of the Watkins water now pending in the amount of \$195.31 be reduced by \$28.10 to reflect that portion of the water bill which it is estimated occurred prior to the rate increase effective June 1, 1972 and, BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the appropriate adjustments be made in the books and records of the Maple Avenue Water District and an adjustment be negotiated if possible with the supplier of the Maple Avenue Water District, i.e., the Village of Palmyra.

The Clerk read a letter from Town Justice Hart Pierce, Jr. asking that his resignation be accepted, to become effective January 1, 1973.

David VanderMolen rejoined the meeting and asked for an explanation and clarification of the Notice of Public Hearing for Arnold Pechler. He felt the wording in the notice did not properly describe the area involved in the request for Variance.
