This includes all information from the Sheriff's office, including town and village.
- 2. **Request for a Congratulatory Letter:** The request was received for a congratulatory letter to Eagle Scout Stephen Krolak, of Palmyra Troop 96. Town Clerk Lynne Green will send Stephen a letter on behalf of the Town Board.
- 3. <u>Invitation for Memorial Day Parade</u>: A letter of invitation was received from the James R. Hickey American Legion Post 120, for the Town Officials to participate in this year's Memorial Day Parade on Monday, May 31. - 4. **Letter of Concern About Ambulance Services:** The following letter was received from East Palmyra resident Roy C. Wilck, concerning a possible merger of ambulance services, and how it would affect East Palmyra residents:

LETTER OF CONCERN ABOUT AMBULANCE SERVICES Palmyra Town Board:

Subject: Possible merger of ambulance services in the Towns of Palmyra and Macedon

I admit that *I* have not been able to make any of the information meetings in this regard.

What I am concerned about will be the response time for the far reaches of the townships.

I believe that a larger area than the 2 towns should be involved. I think that the County needs to be involved. I know that it will not come by overnight but could take up to eight or ten years. The crux of the problem is that the Volunteer Fire Departments are unable to do third party billing (state law), and it is capability of non-fire department ambulances to help fund their operations that is causing a problem. Also there is a shortage of volunteers at some times of the day or night so that response is impossible and delays occur in calling another agency. I know that sometimes it takes up to one half hour or longer to get an ambulance to the emergency. This is too long when a life is in the balance.

I am not necessarily in favor of a paid service, but it may have to come to that and that is why I believe that this should come from the county level. I believe that separate ambulance districts need to be developed to equate equal response times to far corners of all districts. This could be done by NOT adhering to town or municipal lines. Perhaps they could be staffed by volunteers, paid, or a combination, 24/7. This could be accomplished at the county level and not between townships.

Thank you, and I hope that Mr. Miller will take this to the county level for us.

- 2. Town Clerk's Office Report for May: The report includes news that each Town may be picking up all duties and expenses concerning dog licensing. Word is that the State will be giving up all dog licensing, due to proposed budget cuts. A copy of the 2010 Community Resource Guide was included in each Board member's packet of information. Board members read the Town Clerk's Office Report without comment.
- 3. **North Creek Road Speed Reduction Request:** A letter was received in May from the New York State Department of Transportation, Region 4, in Rochester, which answers the request Palmyra has made for speed reduction on the middle segment of North Creek Road. It reads:

"We have completed our investigation on North Creek Road, C.R. 223, between South Creek Road and a point 0.5 mile east of Route 21 relative to the establishment of a lower speed limit.

"A representative from this office made a visit to the site to observe the roadway characteristics and make an analysis of the speed of the vehicles by use of radar. We met with the Traffic Supervisor from the New York State Police at this location to seek his input about lowering the speed limit.

"In consideration of the roadway characteristics, radar data and the review by the State Police, we determined that a reduction of the speed limit is not warranted at this time.

It is "a holistic look at the document output environment, and the resulting Executive Summary Proposal will provide decision support in the area of document management. It requires cost data from Town of Palmyra to develop an understanding of current spending and to evaluate potential solutions for cost savings."

Supervisor Miller stressed that the Assessment Study is free, and he is asking the Board to authorize the Supervisor to sign the agreement to do this Study. This will include assessment at Town Hall, the Highway Department and Justices. There is no further obligation to the Town. Dave Nussbaumer made the motion to authorize the Supervisor to sign the agreement.

13. **Request to Withdraw from County Reinsurance Plan:**

It appears it is no longer cost effective for the Town of Palmyra to continue its participation in the Wayne County Health Care Plan Trust—the self-insurance plan (POMCO).
