January 10, 1952

The regular meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Palmyra was called to order by Supervisor Mate on January 10, 1952 at 2:30 pm in the Town Clerk's Office with the following members present:

Sherwood W. Mate, Supervisor
Kingsley F. Young, Justice
Abram Cleason, Frank O. Newell, Town Councilmen

James DeBrine, Highway Superintendent was also present at this meeting.

The minutes of the previous meeting were read, being no objections, Mr. Newell moved they be approved as read, seconded by Mr. Cleason. Upon vote of the board, carried.

Mr. Newell Moved that Helen M. Jeffery be appointed to succeed herself as Registrar of Vital Statistics and Harold E. Jeffery as her deputy seconded by Mr. Cleason. Carried by a vote of 4 ayes, no nays.

Mr. Cleason moved that Harold E. Jeffery and Harry E. Young be appointed as deputy town clerks with all the powers of a town clerk, seconded by Mr. Young. Carried by a vote of 4 ayes and no nay.

And that Harry E. Young be compensated as fixed by the board for his services.
Mr. Cleason moved that Mary C. Johnson be appointed to succeed herself as Town Historian for the year 1952, seconded by Mr. Newell. Upon vote of the board carried. Ayes 4, Noos 0.

Mr. Newell moved that Elman K. Cowell and Roy Fullman be appointed as Town Constables for the year 1952, seconded by Mr. Young. Upon vote of the Board carried. Ayes: 4, Noos 0.

Mr. Newell moved that Harry E. Young be appointed as Chairman of Board of Assessors, seconded by Mr. Cleason. Upon vote of the board, unanimously carried.

Mr. Cleason moved that the salaries of the elective and appointive officers be as follows: Supervisor-\$2100, Justices-\$800 each, Councilmen-\$300 each, Town Clerk-\$2000, Highway Superintendent-\$4000, Assessors-Chairman \$850, \$600 for the other two, Tax Collector-\$800.00, Elman K. Cowell, Constable-\$360, Historian-\$200 seconded by Mr. Young. Upon vote of the board, carried by the following vote: Ayes: 4, Noos 0.

Mr. Cleason moved that the Election Inspector be paid \$12 per day for each primary, Registration and Election Day in 1952 and the Custodians be paid \$40 each for their services in 1952, seconded by Mr. Newell. Upon vote of the board carried, ayes: 4, noos 0.

Mr. Cleason moved that the Town Officers be paid 8 cents per mile for the use of their automobile for each mile actually and necessarily traveled by them in the performance of their duties of their office and also all expenses incurred in executing the duties of their office seconded by Mr. Cleason. Carried by the following vote: Ayes 4, Noos 0.

Mr. Newell moved that the Palmyre Courier Journal be designated as the official newspaper for the Town of Palmyra, seconded by Mr. Olgason. Upon vote of the board carried by the following: Ayes 4, noes 0.

Mr. Cleason moved that the Union Trust Co. of Rochester, Palmyra Branch be designated as a depository for all town funds, seconded by Mr. Newell. Upon vote of the board, unanimously carried.

Mr. Newell moved that the second Thursday in each month be the day set for the regular board meetings of the Town Board, seconded by Mr. Young, carried by the following vote: Ayes 4, noes 0.

The following motion was made by Mr. Cleason, seconded by Mr. Newell that the Town Officers be empowered to attend the annual meeting of the New York State Association of Town at Buffalo, Feb. 6, 7, & 8 and that their expenses be a town charge and also that Mr. Mate be designated as the delegate for the Town of Palmyra and Mr. DeBrins as the alternate. Upon vote of the board carried, ayes: 4, noes: 0.

Sherwood W. Mate, Supervisor is hereby directed and authorized to duly execute and to present said application to the New York State Youth Commission for its approval.

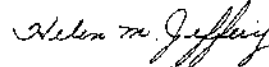

A Special Meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Palmyra was called by the Supervisor on Tuesday, February 12, 1952, at 10:30 A.M. at Mr. Tabor's Office (acting town attorney) with the following members present:

Hart B. Pierce, jr., Justice of the Peace
Frank O. Newell, Town Councilman

The following resolution was offered by Mr. Pierce, who moved its adoption and seconded by Mr. Newell:

WHEREAS, the contract heretofore entered into between the Town Board of the Town of Palmyra and the Village of Palmyra, dated February 25th, 1947 providing for fire protection to be furnished by the Village of Palmyra to the territory in the Town of Palmyra embraced in the Palmyra Fire Protection District will expire at midnight on February 29th, 1952, and

WHEREAS, it appears to be for the best interest of all persons and parties concerned that fire protection continue to be furnished to said fire protection district for an additional period of five years,

BE IT RESOLVED that this Town Board hold a public hearing at the Town Clerk's Office on Cuyler Street, in the Village and Town of Palmyra on the 28th day of February, 1952, at 8 o'clock in the afternoon for the purpose of considering the contracting with the Village of Palmyra for fire protection to be furnished by said Village of Palmyra through its fire department to the fire protection district in the Town of Palmyra known as Palmyra Fire Protection District upon the following general terms to wit:

(a) The fire department of said village shall answer and attend upon all calls in said district.

(b) For such service, said village shall receive Fifteen Hundred Dollars (\$1500) per year.

(c) The district shall be responsible for payment of all claims for injuries to or death of a fireman or firemen in connection with such calls.

(d) The contract shall be for a period of five years from March 1st, 1952.

(e) Such other incidental terms as may be necessary or proper in connection with such contracting.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Town Clerk be and she hereby is directed to publish a notice of such public hearing twice in the Palmyra Courier Journal, a weekly newspaper having circulation in the Palmyra Fire Protection District, and being the official newspaper of the Town of Palmyra, the first publication to be at least ten days before the date of said public hearing.

This agreement, made this 28 day of February, 1952, between the Town Board of the Town of Palmyra, Wayne County, New York, herein-after described as party of the first part, and the Village of Palmyra Wayne County, New York, hereinafter designated as party of the second part, WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, there has been duly established in the said Town of Palmyra, a fire protection district known as Palmyra Fire Protection District, embracing all the territory in said town except that portion embraced in the East Palmyra Fire Protection District and the area embraced in the corporate limits of the Village of Palmyra, as such territory is more fully described in a resolution establishing Palmyra Fire Protection District, and duly adopted by the Town Board of said Town, on August 16th, 1946 and the contract under which fire protection has been furnished to said district by party of the second part being about to expire and

WHEREAS, the following public hearing duly called, the said Board, the party of the first part, duly authorized a contract with the party of the second part; duly authorized a contract with the party of the second part for fire protection to said district upon the terms and provisions herein set forth; and

WHEREAS, this contract has also been duly authorized by the President and Village Board of the party of the second part,

NOW, THEREFORE, the party of the first part does engage the party of the second part to furnish fire protection to said district, and the party of the second part agrees to furnish said protection in the manner following, to wit-

1. At least one fire company of said party of the second part shall at all times during the period of this agreement be subject to call for attendance upon any fire occurring in said district and when notified by alarm, telephone call or in any other manner by any person within the district of a fire within the district, such company shall respond and attend upon the fire without delay with its equipment, and upon arriving at the scene of the fire, the firemen of the party of the second part attending shall proceed diligently and in every way reasonably suggested to the extinguishment of the fire and the saving of life and property in connection therewith.

2. In consideration of furnishing aid and the use of its apparatus as aforesaid, the party of the second part shall receive the sum of (\$1500) each year during the period of this agreement, and the party of the first part covenants and agrees in behalf of said Fire Protection District to pay the same to the party of the second part.

3. The party of the first part shall also pay any and all claims authorized by law for medical expenses, loss of wages, compensation benefits or other claims arising by reason of the injury to or death of a fireman sustained while in the performance of his duties as such fireman, or said party of the first part may provide for the same by insurance.

4. All moneys to be paid under any provision of this agreement shall be a charge upon the said Fire Protection District to be assessed and levied upon the taxable property in said District and collected with the town taxes.

5. This agreement shall continue for a period of five years from the 1st day of March, 1952.

6. The equipment and apparatus to be furnished by party of the second part under the terms of this contract shall meet the minimum requirements of the New York Fire Insurance Rating Organization concerning Class C 2 classification.

7. In the event the area at present embraced within the bounds of the Palmyra Fire Protection District be changed during the life of this contract, the parties hereto mutually covenant and agree to adjust the compensation to be paid by party of the first part to party of the second part at such a sum as the parties mutually agree upon.

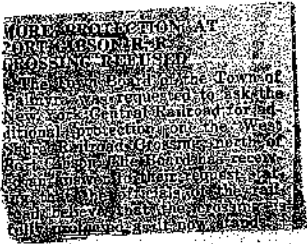

"Port Gibson Road is now protected by standard crossing signs, and a check of the travel made for a 24-hour period commencing 7:00 a.m., October 17th, indicated a total of only 197 vehicles for the entire 24 hours. With this light volume of traffic we feel that the expense for providing additional protection is not justified.

"The situation at Division Road is quite different as we find there is a large volume of traffic moving over this crossing, apparently due to the fact that the crossing is used by employes of the Garlock Packing Company going to and from work. The crossing is now protected by automatic warning bell, but we are agreeable to the installation of flashing light signals."

Please inform the Town Board of the company's offer and, if it is found acceptable to the Board, forward to the Commission a resolution withdrawing its petition

An itemized summary of my activities during that period is as follows: 29 motor vehicle hearings (1 case pending), 46 Civil Cases (5 cases pending), 7 Criminal Cases, 2 Marriages, 2 Warrants issued.

The sum of \$362.00 in fines and fees collected during the above period has been duly sent to the State Comptroller's Office at Albany.

Dear Members:

Following is my report as Highway Superintendent of the Town of Palmyra for the year 1952:

From January 1st, thru April 15th our highway employees were employed taking care of the snow and ice on town, county and state roads and also making the necessary repairs to the town owned equipment.

On June 1, construction was started on the Stafford Road under the Erwin plan, a distance of 1.2 miles. 2620 yds of gravel, 465½ tons of stone and 10,800 gallons of bituminous material, costing \$3210.83 was used on this road. Labor amounted to \$2092.00 and machinery rental \$6172, making a total cost of \$11,474.73. Our state share under this project amounted to \$2128.56, of which \$1500 was credited to Item I and \$628.56 to Item III.

On July 1st, construction was resumed to the Lyon Road, a county road project. Except for the bridge and 1500 feet which was done in 1952, this road a distance of 3.1 miles was completed and accepted by the County. The town has been reimbursed from the county for payrolls \$7,230.50 and for machinery rental \$12,583.70.

Besides the above, all roadsides have been mowed twice, some three times. 202 feet of culvert pipe has been placed, 5 miles of road graveled, 100 tons of calcium chloride used on town roads and 4½ miles of road surface treated, using 17,874 gallons of oil and 476.6 tons of stone.

We've received \$4521.30 from the State & County for snow and ice control, of which \$2727.83 credited to Item IV and \$1793.47 to Item III, Machinery rental.

We've purchased one new F-8 Ford truck, paid the balance of the bay city shovel amounting to \$5,625.00, one-way snow plow and a 1953 Ford Club Coupe.
