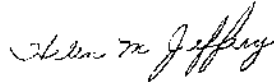

It was the opinion of this Board that Mr. Gene Spanganberg be granted water service from the Canandaigua Water District provided that he can prove to the Board that some part of his lot is within the water district and that written consent be given by him to the Board that said lot and all structures thereon shall be considered to be entirely within said district for purposes of assessment for such water district tax. This consent to bind him and all subsequent property owners.

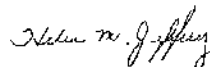

One #12 Caterpillar Self-propelled Tandem Drive Motor Grader

for a maximum price of Twenty-one thousand six hundred dollars (\$21,600.00) delivered at Palmyra, New York and to be delivered on or about May 10, 1959.

The Town Superintendent of Highways is hereby authorized, subject to the approval of theCounty Superintendent of Highways, to surrender to the Vendor 1948 Rome Grader as part payment for the above machinery to be purchased.
