

**REGULAR MEETING OF THE TOWN BOARD
PALMYRA TOWN HALL
May 26, 2016**

At 7:01 p.m., Supervisor Kenneth Miller called to order the Town Board meeting, scheduled for Thursday, May 26, 2016, at the Palmyra Town Hall, 1180 Canandaigua Rd, Palmyra, New York.

CALL TO ORDER

Supervisor Miller led those present in the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag.

There was no official hearing this evening.

GUEST SPEAKER

Ora Rothfuss, representing the Genesee Land Trust and local farmer, Frank Koeberle, explained that a couple years ago Mr. Koeberle approached the Town of Palmyra to aid in a grant to sell the easement to his farmland as a conservation easement. This meant that there would never be a housing development located on that property, and that it would always be a farm. To buy an easement the state pays 87 ½% of its value to the farmer. The agreement was never completed a couple of years ago because of a mix up with the paperwork.

KOEBERLE FARMS

Mr. Koeberle has come forward once again to ask for the support of the Town of Palmyra. Supervisor Miller highlighted some of the current points, as well as differences, in the current proposal. Mr. Miller explained the differences from last application: that this would mean the town/farmer are selling the rights to this land and could never be developed, the property adjacent to RT 21 was pulled out from previous proposal so that it could indeed be developed, there are actually two applications for this land as it is on the boundary of Ontario County (they are making the same request of Manchester), and finally, that previously the Town would have need to take the lead. That is no longer the case, and there are now three scenarios: 1) the town is lead, 2) the Town partners with the Land Trust, or 3) the Land Trust takes the lead on their own. This needs to be submitted by June 15, 2016.

Supervisor Miller made the recommendation that we pass **Resolution #9-2016 Town of Palmyra Partnership with the Genesee Land Trust** later this evening and that also allows the Genesee Land Trust to take the lead. This way the Trust will have to complete all paperwork, manage all monies, and “police” property in the future to make sure agreement is carried on. It was asked if the agreement could ever be broken. Mr. Rothfuss explained that reversing the agreement never makes financial sense because all money would need to get paid back, and that any tax implications are minimal as this land is taxed as agricultural acres. Mr. Miller stated that this is a competitive process and though we may sign tonight; it is not a “done deal”. Only one of four of these applications is awarded.

Mr. Koeberle added that he has spent lots of time (has farmed for over 61 years!) and money to improve his farm, and that he would like to see it stay agricultural, and this program could help him realize this goal. Mr. Koeberle is interested in moving ahead whether or not Manchester is willing to submit a grant application.

Supervisor Miller asked that a vote be taken now.

WHEREAS, the Koeberle family is willing to offer the easements at a bargain sale of 87.5% of the value of the easement to protect their farmland, now, therefore be it

4. **Mike Catalano, EMS Advisory Committee:** Mr. Catalano said that May was a slow month: just 48 calls and Fingerlakes Ambulance failed to cover 5. He suggested that the board request a monthly report so that it would be easier to understand the calls. Supervisor Miller agreed and will be contacting them to request monthly reports rather than the current annual reports. Mr. Catalano also alerted the board that the county is looking at a new ambulance tracker system to aid EMS agents in the counties so they know who to tone out as next closest, while skipping those ambulances that are already out on call.

End of April thru this part of May has been a fantastic time for catching up on tasks that had been set aside. We have also seen an upswing in the number of marriage licenses being issued, tourists stopping by for information, and water payments being collected now that we are one of the last three clerk’s offices collecting for WC Water and Sewer Authority.

Impact Theater is moving in this coming Memorial Day weekend, and will be renting the two smaller rooms on the south side of the building, as well as the large office on the east side. Wayne ARC will be washing the rooms before they move in.

Through dog licensing in April, we sold 107 licenses totaling \$806.00, misc sales, EZ Passes, (which are still selling well!), marriage licenses, hunting/fishing, vital record requests, code, etc- added an additional \$10,365.45. Total check disbursements for the month of May were \$11,171.45.

Lastly, Julie and I will be taking twenty plus boxes of records to be destroyed to Wayne ARC that have reached their records retention at this time. There will be more later this year as the other departments turn the records in to us that are no longer wanted and do not need to be kept according to the MU-1 retention schedule.

3. Green Angel School Supply Drive: The Green Angels would like to collect school supplies from July 11th- August 15th, 2016, and will be leaving a collection box at the town clerks office. The board agreed that was a good idea and that it should only be available when the town clerk office is open.

- **Personnel** –
 - Gerald East started as a summer laborer with us on 5/18/16
 - Chris Bratt started back mowing with us on 5/17/16
- **Winter Summary** – We ended the winter season with 59 trips out of the barn and utilized approximately 1477 tons of our 2800 ton allotment, which approximately 53% of our requested allotment. My new salt allotment is due on 5/30/16 and I will be adjusting our allotment down as our barns are essentially already full. We still have approximately \$50K unexpended to use for the remainder of the Town fiscal year.

- **Training/Personnel –**
 - 5/5/16 - The entire crew attended Bobcat Operation & Safety refresher course at our shop.
 - 5/24/16 - The entire crew attended Mine Safety annual refresher course held in our shop.
- **Highway Facility Issues/Update** - Dan Pieters, an architect from Labella Associates, met with Councilman Welch and I this past Monday morning 5/23/16 to see our highway facility grounds. Before we look to apply for any grant funding it was recommended that we determine our needs. To assist with making an informed decision in how best to spend our taxpayer monies on the needs and wants of the highway facility we discussed performing a Building Condition Survey. A proposal for Labella to perform this BCS is also on our agenda tonight.
- **Garbage Dumping update** - The trash that was deposited along Vault Road and Hogback Hill Road is still there. The defendant did not show for his court date in Palmyra last week. I was subsequently informed by the investigator that we could pickup the roadside. However, I have been working with the WC Sheriffs Probation Department for assistance in this removal effort.

Any questions, comments or concerns I will be glad to answer.

Superintendent of Highways Mike Boesel, and Councilman Welch further reported to the board that they met with Dan Pieters from LaBella (architects), who are preparing to do a *building conditions survey*, which will aid in the decision as to whether to rebuild the entire highway department campus, or fix the building and truck storage bays that are in the worst shape. They further explained that if this survey was approved this evening, the findings could be presented at the June 14th workshop. Discussion ensued regarding wants for the buildings that have turned into needs and the possibility of funding with grants. More will be known after the building conditions survey is complete. It was pointed out that the fuel canopy does in fact belong to the school district. Councilman Cook asked what this survey would include. Councilman Welch explained they will determine whether or not something is better to replace rather than fix, digital photography of the effected area, along remedies and solution for these issues. The entire 22,400 square feet will be totally analyzed. Mr. Miller stated that grants cannot be looked at until something like this is complete; and LaBella is able to look for these grants.

I attended a continuing education class in Batavia earlier this month that was very educational on how to use excel along with the reports that can be generated out of our real property program.
