January 12, 1950

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A Special Meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Palmyra was called by Supervisor, Sanford M. Young on Thursday, January 12th 1950 at 2:00 p.m. at the Town Clerk's Office for the purpose of considering and acting upon the adoption of a resolution authorizing the issuance and sale of \$8700.00 of Town of Palmyra bonds covering Canandaigua Road Water District, and such other business that might come before the Board.

The following resolution was offered by Sherwood W. Mate, Councilman who moved its adoption, and seconded by Hart B. Pierce, Jr., Justice of the Peace:

BOND RESOLUTION ADOPTED JANUARY 12th, 1950, AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE AND SALE OF SERIAL BONDS OF THE TOWN OF PALMYRA, WAYNE COUNTY, NEW YORK, IN THE AMOUNT OF \$8700.00 FOR THE CONSTRUCTION OF A WATER DISTRIBUTION SYSTEM IN CANANDAIGUA ROAD WATER DISTRICT.

Be IT RESOLVED this 12th day of January, 1950 by the Town Board of the Town of Palmyra, Wayne County, New York as Follows:

Section 1. For the object or purpose of construction of a water distribution system in the Canandaigua Road Water District of the Town of Palmyra Wayne County, New York, and to provide funds to defray the cost thereof, Eighty-Seven Hundred Dollars (\$8700.00) of general obligation serial bonds of the Town of Palmyra, Wayne County, New York, to be of the terms, form and contents hereinafter provided for, shall be issued pursuant to the provisions of the Local Finance Law of the State of New York

Section 2. Nine Thousand Four Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$9450.00) is the estimated as the maximum cost of the object or purpose for which such serial bonds are to be issued, to wit, the construction of a water distribution system in the Canandaigua Road Water District in said Town of Palmyra.

Section 3. The plan for the financing of such object or purpose, to wit, the construction of such water system, consists of the issuance of serial bonds of the said Town of Palmyra in the principal sum of Eighty-Seven Hundred Dollars (\$8700.00) Thereby providing such sum toward the maximum estimated cost of such object or purpose, and the balance of such cost, to wit, Seven Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$750.00) shall be paid from current funds available therefor with the meaning of Paragraph a of Section 107.00 of the Local Finance Law.

Section 4. It is hereby determined that the object or purpose for which such serial bonds are to be issued falls within Section 11.00 (a), Subdivision 1. of the Local Finance Law,

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and that the period of probable usefulness of such object or purpose is forty (40) years.

Section 5. The proposed maturity of the serial bonds hereby authorized will be in excess of five years.

Section 6. There has been provided prior to the issuance of such bonds the sum of Seven Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$750.00) from current funds toward the cost of such project.

Section 7. The said Eighty-Seven Hundred Dollars (\$8700.00) in serial bonds shall be dated February 1st, 1950, numbered from 1 to 15 inclusive, maturing in numerical order in the amount of Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) annually on the first day of February in each of the years 1951 to 1955 inclusive, and Six Hundred Dollars \$600.00) annually on the first day of February in each of the years 1956 to 1963 inclusive, and Seven Hundred Dollars (\$700.00) annually on the first day of February in each of the years 1964 and 1965; shall bear interest at a rate of not exceeding five per centum per annum stated in a multiple of one-tenth of one per centum, the exact rate to be determined by the Town Supervisor on receipt of bids, payable semi-annually on the first days of February and August in each year, evidenced by interest coupons to be thereupon attached. Said bonds shall be signed on behalf of the Town of Palmyra by the Supervisor of the Town of Palmyra, and sealed with the corporate seal of the said Town of Palmyra, and shall be attested by the Town Clerk of said Town and the interest coupons shall be signed by the Supervisor of the Town of Palmyra; and both principal of and interest on said bonds shall be payable in lawful money of the United States of America at the Union Trust Company of Rochester, Palmyra Office, at Palmyra, New York.

Section 8. Said serial bonds shall be issued in substantially the following form, to wit:

The Town of Palmyra, in the County of Wayne, a municipality of the State of New York, hereby acknowledges itself indebted and for value received promises to pay to the bearer of this bond or, if it be registered, to the registered holder, on the 1st day of February, 19___, the sum of _____ Dollars (\$_____), and to pay interest on such sum at the rate of _____ per centum (____%) per annum, semi-annually on the first days of February and August in each year from the date of this bond until it matures, upon presentation and surrender, as they severally mature, of the coupons therefor annexed hereto or, if this bond be registered, to the registered holder. Both principal of and interest on this bond will be paid in lawful money of the United States of America at the Union Trust Company of Rochester, Palmyra Office, at Palmyra, New York

This bond may be converted into a registered bond in accordance with the provisions of the Local Finance Law.

This bond is one of an authorized issue, the aggregate principal amount of which is eight-Seven Hundred Dollars (\$8700.00) the bonds of which are of like tenor except as to number, maturity and denomination, and are issued pursuant to a bond resolution entitled "Bond Resolution adopted January 1, 1950, Authorizing the issuance and Sale of Serial Bonds of the town of Palmyra, Wayne County, New York, in the amount of \$8700.00 for the Construction of a Water Distribution System in Canandaigua Road Water District.", duly adopted by the Town Board of the Town of Palmyra on January 1, 1950.

The faith and credit of such Town of Palmyra are hereby irrevocably pledged for the punctual payment of the principal of and interest on this bond according to its terms.

It is hereby certified and recited that all conditions, acts and things required by the Constitution and Statutes of the State of New York to exist, to have happened and to have been performed precedent to and in the issuance of this bond, exist, have happened and have been performed, and that the issue of bonds of which this is one, together with all other indebtedness of such Town of Palmyra, New York, is within every debt and other limit prescribed by the Constitution and Laws of such State.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, the Town of Palmyra, New York, has caused this bond to be signed by its Supervisor, and its corporate seal to be hereunto affixed and attested by its Town Clerk and the coupons hereto attached to be authenticated by the signature of its Supervisor and this bond to be dated as of the 1st day of February, 1950.

Section 9. The Town Supervisor, not more than fifteen days nor less than three days before the sale of said bonds shall file with the State Comptroller of the State of New York, a supplemental debt statement and file a duplicate thereof with the Town Clerk in compliance with Section 109.00 of the Local Finance Law.

Section 10. The Town Supervisor is hereby authorized and directed to sell such bonds at public sale in the manner required by law, and shall give notice thereof as prescribed by law and and rule or order of the Comptroller of the State of New York, and the Palmyra Courier Journal, a weekly newspaper printed in the English language, is hereby designated to public the notice of sale of said bonds.

Section 11. When said bonds shall have been duly sold, the same shall be delivered by the Town Supervisor to the purchaser upon payment to him of the purchase price including accrued interest, and the receipt of the Town Supervisor shall be a full acquittance to said purchaser who shall not be obliged to see to the application of the purchase money.

Section 12. The faith and credit of said Town of Palmyra are hereby pledged to the payment of the principal of said bonds and interest thereon when due. A amount sufficient to pay the principal and interest on said bonds as the same become due each year shall be included in the annual budget of said Town for the year, and the said bonds shall not be renewed.

Section 13. This resolution shall take effect immediately and supersedes the resolution of this Town Board adopted April 5th, 1949 but in no way affects the validity of the bond anticipation notes or capital note heretofore issued pursuant to said resolution of April 5th, 1949.

Order of Board establishing Water Dist. Maple Ave.

Before the Town Board of the Town of Palmyra, Wayne County, New York

In the Matter of the Establishment of the Maple Avenue Water District in the Town of Palmyra, County of Wayne and State of New York.

A petition in the above matter for the creation of a water district having been duly presented to this Town Board, together with the necessary map and plan attached thereto, and an order having been duly adopted by this Town Board on August 10th, 1949, for a public hearing of all persons interested in the matter on September 7th, 1949, at 7:30 o'clock P.M. (EDST), at the Justice Court Room in the Village Hall on East Main Street, in the Village and Town of Palmyra, and a hearing by said Board having been duly held at such time and place, of which due notice was given as required by law, and it having been duly resolved and determined after a public hearing and on September 14th, 1949, to which date matter was adjourned on September 7th, 1949, that the petition herein was signed and acknowledged or proved as required by law and otherwise sufficient, and that all the property and property owners within the proposed district were benefited thereby that all property and property owners

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benefited were included within the limits of the proposed district, and that it was in the public interest to grant in whole the relief sought, and it having been then and there further duly resolved that the establishment of such district as proposed be approved, and application having been thereafter and on or about September 23rd, 1949 duly made in duplicate to the State Department of Audit and Control at Albany, New York, for permission to create such district as more fully provided for by Town Law, Section 194 and the State Comptroller having duly made an order in duplicate, dated January 4th, 1950 granting permission for the creation of the district in all respects as petitioned for and approved by the Town Board as aforesaid; and one copy of such order having been duly filed in the office of the State Department of Audit and Control at Albany, New York, and the other in the office of the Town Clerk of this Town, and the Town Clerk having duly presented such order to this Board at this meeting, being its first meeting held after the said order was filed with her; it is hereby

ORDERED, that a water district be established in the said Town of Palmyra, Wayne County, New York, as described in the order of the State Comptroller aforesaid, to be designated as the Maple Avenue Water District of the Town of Palmyra, Wayne County, New York, and to be of the following description and boundaries, to wit:

Beginning at a point in the assumed north boundary line of the public highway known as Walton Road at its point of intersection with the line parallel with and 100 feet westerly from the center line of the public highway known as Division Street; thence (1) southerly along said line 100 feet west from the center line of Division Street to its intersection with the northerly line of lands of the State of New York appropriated for Barge Canal purposes; thence (2) southwesterly, westerly, northwesterly and westerly along the various courses of the northerly line of the Barge Canal property to a point in the east boundary line of the public highway known as Maple Avenue; thence (3) northerly along the east boundary line of Maple Avenue to the point of intersection with the south boundary line of Walton Road; thence (4) westerly along the south boundary line of said Walton Road to a point five hundred (500) feet west of the center line of Maple Avenue; thence (5) northerly along the line parallel with and five hundred (500) feet westerly from the center line of Maple Avenue to a point opposite the point in the center line of Maple Avenue distant five thousand six hundred forty (5640) feet northerly from the center line of Walton Road measured along said center line of Maple Avenue; thence (6) easterly passing through said point five thousand six hundred forty (5640) feet northerly along the center line of Maple Avenue from the center line of Walton Road to a point five hundred (500) feet easterly of the center line of Maple Avenue; thence (7) southerly parallel with and 500 feet easterly from the center line of Maple Avenue to a point in the assumed north line of the highway known as the Walton Road to a point five hundred (500) feet east of the center line of Maple Avenue; thence (8) easterly along the assumed north line of the highway known as the Walton Road to the point and place of beginning.

WHEREAS, Frank C. Jones, one of the assessors of this Town for many years, departed this life on January 7th, 1950, be it RESOLVED, that the following memoriam be entered in the proceedings of this Board, and that a copy be sent to Mr. Jones' daughter:

Frank C. Jones occupied a unique place in the life of his village and town for the past fifty years. Born in Palmyra, December 5th 1879, he was successively a mason, a mason contractor and a merchant.

Mr. Jones served the Village of Palmyra as trustee and later as president, and for many years up to the time of his death, he was one of the assessors of the Town of Palmyra. This is truly an enviable record of public service.

Many and diverse and admirable attributes were carried into and summed up in his fine character and personality. The regard and affection for him by the people in this community occasioned him pleasurable surprise. That was because he failed to realize how great his contribution had been to the life of his community. If it be true that we take out of life only what we put into it, then Mr. Jones tasted deeply of the cup of life.

Long will this Board and this community be affected, influenced and moved by his personal relation and by his simplicity, candor and sincerity.

The adjourned meeting of January 12th was called to order by Supervisor Young on Wednesday, January 18th, 1950 at 2:00 P.M. with all Board members present as well as Mr. Tabor, acting town attorney; Mr. Smith, Engineer; James DeBrine Hwy Superintendent and Mr. DeWitt in interest of the Maple Ave. water district.

The supervisor opened the meeting. Mr. Smith advised the Board that due to decline in cost of materials needed, the Maple Ave. Water District could be done at an estimated cost of \$24,000.00 instead of the \$31,000.00 as was previously submitted. The following schedule of paying the bonded indebtedness was also given:

The issuance of capital notes due in 1951 and 1952 at a rate of 800 per year.

The issuance of bonds - 4 payments of \$800.00
16 " " 1200.00

allowing twenty-two years to pay.

On the basis of the present assessed valuation the tax rate would amount to around \$16.25 a thousand. If nothing was paid on the bond the first year, the rate per 1000 that year would be an estimated \$9.00 per thousand.

It was advised by the acting town attorney that it would not be necessary to raise the 5% of authorized capital indebtedness the first year.

The matter of the purchase of a stone crusher was again brought before the board. After much thought, Hart B. Pierce, jr. suggested the Highway Superintendent gather as much information as possible as to the rentign of a stone crusher for the first year and report at our next regular board meeting.

James DeBrine, Highway Superintendent recommended the purchase of a new road automobile at a price not to exceed \$481 plus trade-in allowance of present car. Hearing to be held at the Town Clerk's office on May 3, 1950 at 3:00 p.m. Clerk instructed to put such notice in official newspaper.

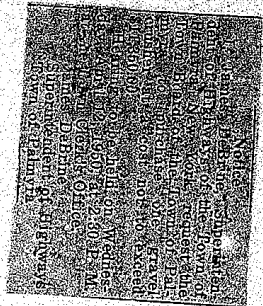

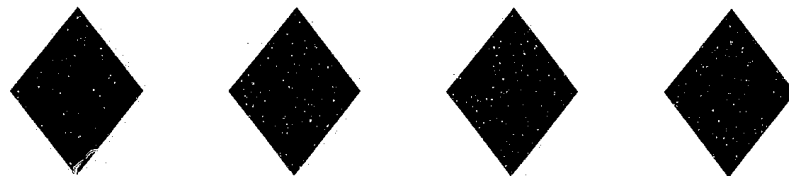

Bond Anticipation Note Resolution

Bond Anticipation Note Resolution of July 10th, 1950
for issuance and sale of notes of the Town of Palmyra,
New York, in anticipation of sale of \$29,400.00 of
Serial Bonds for the construction of a water system
in the Maple Avenue Water District.

WHEREAS, the Town Board of the Town of Palmyra has heretofore adopted a resolution authorizing the construction of a water system in the territory embraced in the territory embraced in the Maple Avenue Water District, and by another resolution adopted at this meeting authorized of certain serial bonds in the amount of \$29,400.00 for the purpose of financing the construction of such system pursuant to the Local Finance Law; and

WHEREAS, there are no bond anticipation notes outstanding which have been previously issued in anticipation of the sale of the aforesaid bonds; and

WHEREAS, the Town Board of the Town of Palmyra desires to now provide for the issuance and form of bond anticipation notes in anticipation of the sale of the aforesaid bonds, and other matters in connection therewith; BE IT, this 10th day of July, 1950.

RESOLVED by the Town Board of the Town of Palmyra, New York as follows:

Section 1. Three bond anticipation notes, one in the amount of fifteen Thousand Dollars (\$15,000.00), one in the amount of Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000.00), and one in the amount of Four Thousand and Four Hundred Dollars (\$4,400.00) shall be issued, or so many thereof as may be required by the Town of Palmyra for the purpose aforesaid and in anticipation of the sale of serial bonds of said Town of Palmyra in the amount of \$29,000.00, as aforesaid, heretofore authorized by a resolution adopted at this meeting entitled "Resolution of July 10th, 1950, authorizing the issuance of \$29,400.00 of Serial Bonds of the Town of Palmyra, for the construction of a water system in the district designated as the Maple Avenue Water District.", and said notes are issued in anticipation of bonds for an assessable improvement. Such bond anticipation notes hereby authorized are original notes and not renewal notes.

Section 2. Such notes shall be dated as the Town Supervisor by his execution thereof shall determine, and will mature August 1st, 1951, and will bear interest at the rate of two per cent per annum, payable semi-annually, payable as to both principal and interest in lawful money of the United States of America at the Palmyra Office of the Union Trust Company of Rochester, and will be signed in the name of the Town of Palmyra by the Supervisor and will be sealed with the seal of said town and attested by the Town Clerk.

Section 3. The said bond anticipation notes will be of substantially the following terms, form and contents, to wit;

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a municipal corporation, hereby acknowledges itself indebted and for value received promises to pay to the bearer of this note, the sum of _____ Dollars (\$ _____), on the 1st day of August, 1951, together with interest thereon from the date hereof at the rate of two percentum (2%) per annum, payable semi-annually. Both principal of and interest on this note will be paid in lawful money of the United States of America, at the Palmyra Office of the Union Trust Company of Rochester.

This note is one of an authorized issue, the aggregate principal amount of which is Twenty-Nine Thousand Four Hundred Dollars (\$29,400.00), the notes of which are of like tenor, except as to number and denomination.

This note is issued pursuant to the provisions of a resolution entitled "Bond Anticipation Note Resolution of July 10th, 1950, for issuance and sale of notes of the Town of Palmyra, New York in anticipation of sale of \$29,400.00 of Serial Bonds for the construction of a water system in the Maple Avenue Water District.", duly adopted by the Town Board of such Town of Palmyra on the 10th day of July, 1950.

The faith and credit of such Town of Palmyra are hereby irrevocably pledged for the punctual payment of the principal of and interest on this note according to its terms.

It is hereby certified and recited that all conditions, acts and things required by the Constitution and statutes of the State of New York to exist, to have happened and to have been performed precedent to and in the issuance of this note, exist, have happened and have been performed, and that this note, together with all other indebtedness of such Town of Palmyra is within every debt and other limit prescribed by the Constitution and laws of such State.

In Witness Whereof, the Town of Palmyra has caused this note to be signed by its Supervisor, and its corporate seal to be hereunto affixed and attested by its Town Clerk, and this note to be dated as of the ____ day of _____, 1950.

Section 4. The faith and credit of said Town of Palmyra are hereby pledged for the payment of the principal of and interest on such bond anticipation notes. Such bond anticipation notes shall be paid from the proceeds derived from the sale of said bonds or may be redeemed as provided by the Local Finance Law of the State of New York.

Section 5. The Supervisor of Said Town of Palmyra is authorized to sell such bond anticipation notes at private sale for not less than par and accrued interest, and the Supervisor is authorized to deliver such bond anticipation notes to the purchaser or purchasers upon payment of the purchase price and accrued interest, as above specified. The receipt of the Supervisor shall be a full acquittance to the purchaser or purchasers who shall not be obliged to see to the application of the purchase money.

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Section 6. This resolution shall take effect immediately.

Contract for Fire Protection-Town of Palmyra and
East Palmyra Fire Dept. Inc.

This agreement, made this 3rd day of August, 1950, between the Town Board of the Town of Palmyra, Wayne County, New York, hereinafter designated as party of the first part, and East Palmyra Fire Department, Inc., a duly incorporated fire company, of East Palmyra, Wayne County, New York, hereinafter designated as party of the second part, WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, there has been duly established in the said Town of Palmyra a fire protection district known as East Palmyra Fire Protection District, embracing a portion of the territory in said Town of Palmyra, such territory being more fully described in the resolution establishing such district and duly adopted by the Town Board of said Town of Palmyra on the 26th day of November, 1943, and

WHEREAS, following a public hearing duly called, the said Board, party of the first part, duly authorized a contract with the party of the second part for fire protection to said district upon terms and provisions hereinafter set forth, and

WHEREAS, this contract has also been duly authorized by the members and officers of said East Palmyra Fire Department, Inc., party of the second part,

NOW, THEREFORE, the party of the first part does engage the party of the second part to furnish fire protection to said district and the party of the second part agrees to furnish such protection in the manner following, to wit:

1. The fire company of said party of the second part shall at all times during the period of this agreement be subject to call for attendance upon any fire occurring in said district

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and when notified by alarm, telephone call or in any other manner by any person within the district of a fire within the district, such company shall respond and attend upon the fire without delay with its equipment, and upon arriving at the scene of the fire, the firemen of the party of the second part attending shall proceed diligently and in every way reasonably suggested to the extinguishment of the fire and the saving of life and property in connection therewith.

2. In consideration of furnishing aid and the use of its apparatus as aforesaid, the party of the second part shall receive the sum of Fifteen Hundred Dollars (\$1500.00) each year during the period of this agreement, and the party of the first part covenants and agrees in behalf of said Fire Protection district, to pay the same to the party of the second part.

3. the party of the first part shall also pay and and all claims authorized by law for medical expenses, loss of wages, compensation benefits or other claims arising by reason of the injury to or death of a fireman sustained while in the performance of his duties as such fireman, or said party of the first part may provide for the same by insurance. Party of the first part shall not be liable or responsible for any damage or injury to the property, apparatus or equipment owned or under the control of party of the second part.

4. All money to be paid under any provision of this agreement shall be a charge upon the said Fire Protection District to be assessed and levied upon the taxable property in said district and collected with the town taxes.

5. This agreement shall run from September 11th, 1950 to September 1st, 1955.

6. The equipment and apparatus to be furnished by party of the second part under the terms of this contract shall meet the minimum requirements of the New York Fire Rating Insurance Organization concerning Class C classification.

Following is a copy of the rules and regulation governing the water districts

RULES AND REGULATIONS GOVERNING THE FURNISHING OF WATER IN EACH OF THE WATER DISTRICTS IN THE TOWN OF PALMYRA, WAYNE COUNTY, NEW YORK.

Section 1 - General

(a) These rules and regulations shall be a part of the contract with any person, firm or corporation which is supplied with water in any water district now or hereafter established in the Town of Palmyra. The word "District" when used herein shall refer to any such water district.

(b) Water will be supplied to persons and premises within the boundaries of any water district in the Town of Palmyra through the facilities of any such district provided therefor, subject to the provisions of these rules and regulations and any contract between the Town of Palmyra and the Village of Palmyra providing for the furnishing of water service by the Village of Palmyra to such water district, in accordance with the scheduled rates and charges on file in the office of the Town Clerk, and also on file in the office of the Village Clerk of the Village of Palmyra, which schedule of rates is hereby made a part of these rules and regulations.

(c) The Town of Palmyra on behalf of the district, and the Village of Palmyra as operator of the district, undertakes to use reasonable care and diligence to provide at all times an adequate supply of water at adequate pressure, but assumes no liability for the failure of the supply. The right is reserved to shut off the water temporarily for the purpose of making repairs, changes or improvements to the system. In case of a shutdown, reasonable effort will be made to notify consumers, but no liability will be assumed for failure to do so. Consumers are cautioned to make adequate provisions against collapse or damage to their boilers because of lack of pressure. All house and other boilers shall be fitted with a suitable check valve to prevent accidents from collapse or damage in case the water is suddenly drawn off from the main pipes.

(d) No persons except the duly authorized employees of the Village of Palmyra as operator of the district, shall do any work upon or operate the mains, valves, hydrants, meters, curb boxes or services of the district, except that in the case of hydrants, members of an organized Fire Department or Fire Company may operate them in the performance of their duties, or for directed drill.

(e) The Town Board reserves the right at any time to rescind, modify, alter, amend or add to these rules and regulations, and the schedules, rates and charges governing the furnishg of water, and a copy of the rules and regulations brought up-to-date shall be on file at all times in the office of the Town Clerk of the Town of Palmyra, and also in the office of the Village Clerk of the Village of Palmyra.

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Section 2 - Application for Water Service

(a) All applications for the use of water must be made in duplicate in writing on a form which will be provided, and shall be left with the Clerk of the Village of Palmyra for processing. Each such duplicate application shall be subscribed by the owner of the premises for which the use of water is sought, which shall import a covenant and agreement on the part of the applicant to be bound by and to comply with in all respects the provisions of these rules and regulations. The application must be accompanied by payment of the tapping and connection charge, in accordance with the scheduled charges on file in the office of the Town Clerk of the Town of Palmyra and the Village Clerk of the Village of Palmyra. The District shall furnish and install or cause to be furnished and installed, and the district shall at all times remain the owner of all equipment from the main to the property line, including coporation stop, service pipe from the main to the property line or curb stop, curb stop and curb box, and this equipment shall be maintained by or for the district and may be removed or changed by or for it at any time. The meter shall be furnished by the Village of Palmyra as the operator of the district and rented to the owner of the premises, but title to the meter shall remain in the Village of Palmyra. Service connections will be made within a reasonable time after the filing of the application therefor, but only during the period from May 1st to October 1st in any calendar year.

(b) Meters shall be installed in all services. All meters will be furnished and set in position by the Village of Palmyra, as operator of the district and a rental charge in accordance with the scheduled rates and charges on file will be made for same. Whenever a meter is to be installed, a suitable place must be provided by the owner, and must be a place free from frost, accessible at all times and properly safeguarded. If it is impossible to place meter where it will be free from frost, a suitable boxing must be built and meter packed to prevent freezing, at the expense of the owner. No person except a duly authorized official or agent of the Village of Palmyra shall open, change, tamper with or otherwise disturb any water meter lawfully connected with the district water system. The cost of repairing any damage which may be sustained by a meter resulting from carelessness of the owner, tenant or agent of the premises, or from neglect of either of them properly to protect the same, as well as any damage that may result from allowing said meter to become frozen, burned, injured or damaged by hot water or steam, shall be paid to the Village of Palmyra, the operator of the district on demand. Whenever an owner of premises shall fail to comply or shall fail to procure compliance by a tenant or other occupant of the premises, with the provisions of this subsection, the Village of Palmyra as operator of the district, in addition to all other penalties provided, may discontinue supplying

water to the premises, without notice, and may in addition, provide, at the expense of the owner, a meter vault and meter at the curb line or other convenient location between the main and the buildings on the said premises.

(c) A separate application must be made, and a separate meter must be installed for each premises, and the owner of each premises shall be required to pay a separate and full scale of water rates for each separate use of water on his premises, a separate use being service supplied for:

1. A single dwelling occupied by members of a single family or household sharing common bathing, washing and sanitary facilities; or

2. Any separate dwelling unit in a single structure occupied by a single family or household sharing common bathing, washing and sanitary facilities, to the exclusion of other occupants of the same structure; or

3. Any portion of any premises occupied by a separate business or other enterprise, using and maintaining any water facilities to the practical exclusion of any other occupant of the same premises. The farm buildings on any farm which are used substantially exclusively in connection with the operation of such farm shall not require a separate application or meter provided water service is supplied to the dwelling on such farm.

(d) No connection shall be made to any service for the benefit of any other residence, family, business or establishment, nor shall any sub-metering of water be allowed. At no time shall there be any physical connection between a water system or source of supply on the premises, and the water system of the district, or any pipe carrying water from the district system, nor shall there be any connections or taps between the meter and the water main.

(e) The necessary labor and materials for completing the installation from the curb cock to the meter shall be furnished and paid for by the applicant for water service. Service pipes shall not be less than 3/4 inch, and must be copper tubing, type K, with swaged joints only. The installation and materials shall be approved by a duly authorized representative of the operator of the district before the trench is back filled. If any defect in the workmanship or materials are found, or if the consumer's service pipe has not been installed in accordance with the specifications or requirements herein provided, water service will not be turned on until such defects have been remedied, and if water service has been turned on before discovery of such defects, the service may be turned off until the defects are remedied. All services installed by the Town of Palmyra during construction or prior to turning the district over to the Village of Palmyra for operation shall be deemed to have been properly installed and of suitable materials.

Section 3. Payment of Water Charges, Penalties, etc.

Charges for water supplied in each quarter year shall be due and payable on the 1st day of March, June, September and December in each year for the preceding quarter, and shall be payable in full without discount or reduction of any kind. There shall be added to any charges remaining unpaid after the last day of each March, June, September and December a penalty of ten per centum of the amount due and unpaid, and if such bill is not paid within sixty days of its due date, the supply of water shall be cut off without notice and thereafter service shall not be restored unless

and until all charges and penalties as aforesaid are paid in full and in addition a fee of \$5.00 be paid.

Dear Sir:

For your information an investigations has been made of traffic conditions on Route 21, S.H. 993, southerly from the Palmyra Village line, Town of Palmyra, Wayne Co.

The section of Route covered extends for a distance of 2800 feet. Sometime ago the Town Board, Town of Palmyra, requested the Commission to consider the possibe need for a formal speed restriction.

The marginal developemnt is confined to residential units most of which are set back from the highway approvimately 100 feet. Through this section alignment and grade condirions are good and there are no locations where sight distance is restricted to less that 500 feet. Shoulders are 3 feet wide on the east side and 10 feet wide on the west side.

The 12-hour traffic count covering movement in both direction developed during the State-wide census taken in August of last year shows approximately 1400 vehicles. On serveral inspection trips through the area no pedestrian experience only 1 accident has been reported for the past several years. This accident happended in 1948 and was due to a skid on icy pavement.

In summary the Commission is of the opinion that the conditons present do not substantiate action to impose a formal speed restriction.

WHEREAS, said water system has now been constructed, and the approximate cost of same can be determined, and it appearing that the total amount of two unissued bond anticipation notes authorized by said resolution of July 10th, 1950 will not be required as originally provided:

BE IT, this 13th day of December, 1950,

RESOLVED by the Town Board of the Town of Palmyra, New York, that said bond anticipation note resolution of July 10th, 1950 be and the same hereby is amended and that one bond anticipation note in the amount of Four Thousand Dollars (\$4,000.00) shall be issued and one in the amount of Ten Thousand, Four Hundred Dollars (10,400) or so many thereof as may be required for the purpose of construction of the water system in the Maple Avenue Water District, instead of the two bond anticipation notes authorized by the resolution of July 10th, 1950, one in the amount of Ten Thousand Dollars (10,000) and one in the amount of Four Thousand Four Hundred Dollars (4,400.00) and that except as herein modified, said bond anticipation resolution of July 10th, 1950, remain in full force and effect and this amended resolution shall take effect immediately.

Hart B. Pierce, jr moved that the report of the examiners on the books of the late Supervisor be accepted as submitted, seconded by Kingsley F. Young. Upon vote of the board, unanimously carried.

Gentlemen:

We have examined the records of the Town of Palmyra as kept by the late supervisor, Sanford M. Young, from January 1st, 1950 through Nov. 24th, 1950.

All receipts received from the County Clerk, Comptroller at Albany Tax Collector, Town Clerk and Constable were found to be properly credited to their respective accounts. Loans made during the year were found in order and the proceeds credited to their respective accounts. All disbursements were checked and found entered in ledger under their proper captions.

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A reconciliation of the following accounts was made: General Town Fund, General Highway Fund, Machinery Fund, Snow & Miscellaneous Fund, Bridge Fund, Welfare Fund, Canandaigua Water District, Johnson Street Water District and Maple Avenue Water District. These Funds total \$41,274.41 and were proved to the last bank statements after the following exceptions were noted.

In the General Town Fund, balance on hand January 1st, 1950 was carried as \$2,425.48, with outstanding checks of \$784.20. Outstanding checks were not listed by number and after a careful check was made, was found to be \$792.25. This will increase the true balance by \$8.05. Deposit of January 9th entered on cash receipts as \$37.85 amount deposited \$48.75, a difference of \$.90. Deposit of March 10th for \$9.05 omitted from cash receipts. Check #122 in amount of \$68.63 payable to the order of Abram Cleason is an outstanding check.

From the receipts and disbursements of the Welfare Fund, it was found that this account is carried on your books in the red.

James DeBrine, Highway Superintendent asked the Town Board for an increase of five cents per hour for the 6 regular highway employees. Kingsley F. Young moved that five cents an hour increase for the 6 regular highway employees be granted, effective January 1, 1951 payroll, seconded by Frank O. Newell, Upon vote of the Board, carried by the following vote: Ayes-5, Noos-0.
